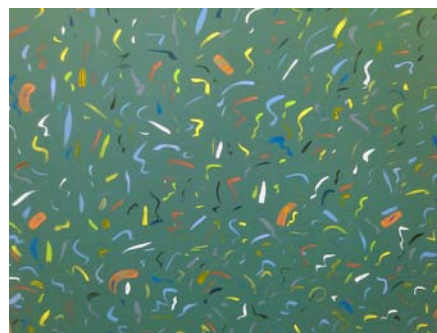

Artist information: , Jane Thode Walsh was the daughter of Dr. Guy Eugene and Elizabeth Roe Thode. On June 18, 1938, she married Charles Henry Walsh Jr. in Burlington. He died March 4, 1991. She earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Iowa, and received a master's degree from University of Iowa in 1997. Walsh's strong affinity for the arts and education spurred her to numerous volunteer positions. She was a member of the Art Guild of Burlington Inc., a Burlington Area Art Council board member, and a member of the Burlington Shakespeare Club. She was an honorary member of the University of Iowa Friends Development Council of University of Iowa Art Museum, where she was a past chairman, a member of University of Iowa Print Club in Iowa City,

Burlington Fine Arts League, charter member of Women in the Arts in Washington, and past board member of Special Arts of Iowa. In addition, she was on the board of the Des Moines County American Red Cross and past state officer. She was appointed to the Mississippi River Parkway Commission, was an officer in the local Kappa Kappa Gamma Sorority and a director of Farmers and Merchants Bancshares Inc. Jane Thode Walsh, who died in 2002 at the age of 87, was a native of Burlington and an artist who exhibited her work throughout the Midwest. She was also a long-time friend of Southeastern Community College and an enthusiastic supporter of the college's art programs, enrolling in art classes at the college from 1974 through 2001. She received an honorary associate's degree from Southeastern Community College in 1992, and served for six years on the board of SCC's Alumni Association. "It's very fitting that Jane's family is commissioning a work of art to commemorate her life and her contributions to SCC," said Becky Rump, SCC executive director of advancement. "The sculpture by James Russell will be a wonderful addition to the landscape of SCC's West Burlington campus."

Artist Information: In addition to his SCC sculpture, Russell has completed more than 85 state, national, and international commissions. His work can be found in numerous highly-regarded public, corporate, and private collections. This is the second sculpture commissioned by the Walsh family. The first, entitled "Tribute," was dedicated in memory of Jane's husband, Charles H. Walsh, Jr., in 1999. It is located on Burlington's waterfront at Riverside Park. "With my work, I seek to inspire and uplift the human spirit and to touch that part of each person's soul that harbors the desire for beauty, serenity and harmony," Russell said. Through the reflective surfaces of Russell's sculptures, the environment becomes its own mirror image, unifying the sculpture and its surroundings. Rump described Russell's monumental sculptures as "ribbons of steel gracefully arching and twirling in space."

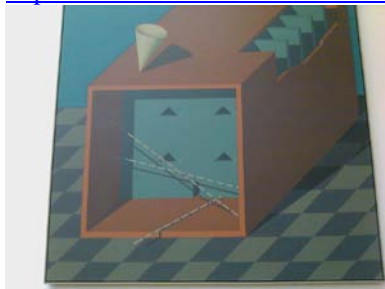
