NEW MINER TRAINING

Federal Mine Safety and Health Act of 1977: Section 115(a)

- (1) New miners having no underground mining experience shall receive no less than **40 hours** of training if they are to **work underground**.
- (2) New miners having no surface mining experience shall receive no less than **24 hours** of training if they are to **work on the surface**.

ANNUAL REFRESHER

Federal Mine Safety and Health Act of 1977: Section 115(a)

- (3) All miners shall receive no less than 8 hours of refresher training no less frequently than once each 12 months.

Which Refresher Do You Need?

Part 46: Surface Annual 8-hour Refresher
Includes all miners employed in MSHA Part 46 industries—surface mines, including contractors working on mine sites.

Part 48: Underground Annual Refresher includes those who work on **surface areas of underground mines**.

Refresher classes are not comprehensive in scope. It is assumed participants meet the MSHA definition of "experienced miner."
